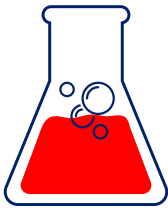

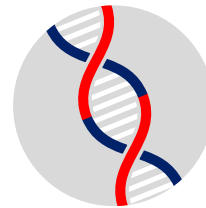

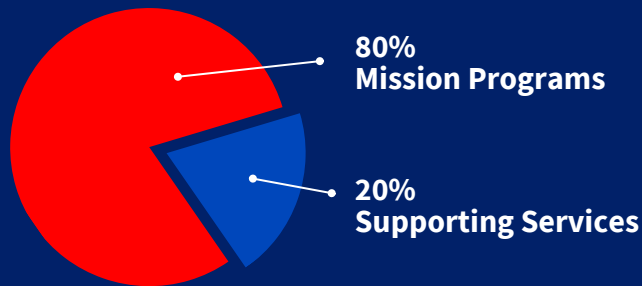

GET SCREENED

is a campaign to encourage patients to resume appropriate cancer screening and follow up care. 1 in 2 men and 1 in 3 women will be diagnosed with cancer in their lifetime.



EARLY DETECTION

of cancer through screening reduces mortality from cancers of the colon and rectum, breast, prostate, uterine, cervix and lung.
