#### WHAT:

A socially distant, safe way to join the Making Strides Against Breast Cancer movement by bringing FIVE friends, family, colleagues, or classmates together in-person in your own neighborhood, without the health risk of big crowds. Pull out your pink tutu or put on your pink style and win bonus points!

#### GET INVOLVED:

Follow these four easy steps to join the adventure:



#### Step One

Sign up as a team leader for Making Strides Against Breast Cancer at [makingstrideswalk.org](http://makingstrideswalk.org). Make it easier to reach \$500 with our digital fundraising app!



#### Step Two

Once you or your team raises **\$500**, watch your email for an invitation to play the game with four of your friends.



#### Step Three

Opt-in by replying to the email. One "tech captain" downloads the cityHUNT app for your group of five players. Larger groups are asked to raise more and form separate teams.



#### Step Four

Compete for bragging rights with other Making Strides Against Breast Cancer supporters who are playing the game at the same time!

#### WHEN:

A two-hour multi-faceted adventure hunt with flexibility to do any day in October 2020. Registration required.

#### WHERE:

Meet up with your friends at a location near your home, school, or workplace.

#### HOW:

Teams raise at least \$500 to play. Then, using the cityHUNT digital app, with clues created exclusively for Making Strides Against Breast Cancer supporters, cityHUNT takes the classic scavenger hunt to the next level. Instead of looking for a list of objects, your group of up to five players will follow clues to solve problems, take pictures, make videos, and celebrate breast cancer survivors. We encourage social distancing and wearing masks while you play.
